Notes forming part of the financial statements

1. Background

Ayurvedagram Heritage Wellness Centre Private Limited was incorporated on 27th January 2003 and CIN is U74140KA2003PTC031511. The Company is into hospital services located in Hemmandanahalli, Sametanahalli post, Whitefield, Bengaluru.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

a. Basis of preparation and presentation of financial statements

i. Accounting Convention

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015.

For all periods up to and including the year ended March 31, 2017, the company prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Accounting Standards earlier notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read together with Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (Indian GAAP).

These are the Company's first annual financial statements prepared in accordance with Ind AS. The Company has adopted all applicable standards and adoptions were carried out in accordance with Ind AS 101 — First time adoption of Indian Accounting Standards.

ii. Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under historical cost convention on accrual basis, unless otherwise stated.

iii. Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires the use of accounting estimates that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statement and reported amounts of revenues and expenses for the year. Actual results could differ from estimates.





All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the schedule III to the Act.

b. Property, plant & Equipment

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Interest and other financing costs relating to borrowed funds attributable to the construction or acquisition of fixed assets are capitalized to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

(i) Depreciation and amortization methods, estimated useful lives and residual value

Depreciation on all fixed assets is provided based on the useful lives of the asset as prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013. Depreciation on additions has been calculated on prorata basis. Capital work-in-progress also includes capital advances.

(ii) Deemed Cost on transition to Ind AS

On transition to Ind AS, the Company has elected to measure all its property, plant and equipment measured as per the previous GAAP and use such carrying value as its deemed cost on the date of transition of Ind AS i.e., 1 April 2016.

c. Inventories

The inventories of all medicines, medicare items traded and dealt with by the company are valued at cost. In the absence of any further estimated costs of completion and estimated costs necessary to make the sale, the net realizable value is not applicable. Cost of these inventories comprises of all costs of purchase and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location.

Stock of provisions, stores, stationeries and housekeeping items are stated at cost. The net realizable value is not applicable in the absence of any further modification/alteration before being consumed in house only. Cost of these inventories comprises of all costs of purchase and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location.



d. Trade Receivables

The trade receivables have been recorded at their respective carrying amounts and are not considered to be materially different from their fair values as these are expected to realize within the credit period. Management believes that the amounts that are past the credit period are collectible in full, based on historical payment behavior and analysis of customer credit risk.

e. Employee benefits

i. Short-term benefits:

A liability is recognised for benefits accruing to employees in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave and other short term benefits in the period related service is rendered at undiscounted amount of benefits expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

ii. Other Long Term benefits:

Post-employment benefit plans are classified into defined benefits plans and defined contribution plans as under:

Gratuity

Gratuity is provided for on arithmetic basis. No actuarial valuation has been done as the amounts are not material.

Provident fund

Payments to defined contribution plans are recognized as expense when employees have rendered service entitling them to the contributions.

f. Revenue recognition

I. Rendering of Services

Revenue primarily comprises fees charged for inpatient and outpatient hospital services. Services include charges for accommodation, medical professional services, equipment and pharmaceutical goods used. Revenue is recorded and recognised during the period in which the hospital service is provided, based upon the estimated amounts due from patients.



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II. · Sale of Goods

Sales are recognised when the risk and reward of ownership is passed to the customer. Revenue is measured at the value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxed and duties collected on behalf of the government. Revenue is stated net of returns and discounts wherever applicable.

III. Other operating revenue

Other operating revenue comprises of Travelling income and other miscellaneous income.

g. Foreign Currency Transaction

Initial Recognition:

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

Conversion:

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing rate. Non-monetary items that are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

Exchange Differences:

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

h. Taxes on Income

Current income tax expense comprises current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period and computed in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are recognized for all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realized.



i. Provision and Contingent Liability.

I. Provisions

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made to settle the obligation

II. Contingent Liability

Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) Possible obligations that arises from past events and the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the enterprise (ii) Present obligation which arises from past events but is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

j. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank in current account, cash in hand and include cheques / drafts in hand and collection due from credit cards.

k. Finance Costs

Finance costs consist of interest and other costs that the entity incurs in connection with borrowing of funds.

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of cost of that asset. Qualifying assets are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue.

I. Financial Instruments

Financial instruments comprise of financial assets and financial liabilities.

I. Financial assets

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortized cost. Financial assets at amortized cost are represented by loans and advances and other deposits, trade receivables, cash and cash equivalents and other advances.

II. Financial Liability

All financial liabilities are recognized initially at fair value and in case of loans and borrowings net of directly attributable costs. Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortized cost using effective interest method. Financial liabilities are represented by borrowings, provisions, Trade payables and other current liabilities.

i. Provision and Contingent Liability.

I. Provisions

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made to settle the obligation

II. Contingent Liability

Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) Possible obligations that arises from past events and the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the enterprise (ii) Present obligation which arises from past events but is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

j. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank in current account, cash in hand and include cheques / drafts in hand and collection due from credit cards.

k. Finance Costs

Finance costs consist of interest and other costs that the entity incurs in connection with borrowing of funds.

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of cost of that asset. Qualifying assets are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue.

I. Financial Instruments

Financial instruments comprise of financial assets and financial liabilities.

I. Financial assets

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortized cost. Financial assets at amortized cost are represented by loans and advances and other deposits, trade receivables, cash and cash equivalents and other advances.





II. Financial Liability

All financial liabilities are recognized initially at fair value and in case of loans and borrowings net of directly attributable costs. Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortized cost using effective interest method. Financial liabilities are represented by borrowings, provisions, Trade payables and other current liabilities.

3. First-time adoption of Ind AS

In accordance with Ind AS 101 on First-time adoption of Indian Accounting Standards, the Company's first Ind AS financial statements include, three balance sheets, namely, the opening balance sheet as at 1 April 2016 and balance sheets as at 31 March 2017 and 2018, and statements of profit and loss, cash flows and changes in equity for the years ended 31 March 2017 and 2018 together with related notes. The same accounting policies have been used for all periods presented, except where the Company has made use of exceptions or exemptions allowed under Ind AS 101 in the preparation of the opening Ind AS balance sheet. The balance sheets, statements of profit and loss, statements of cash flows and statements of changes in equity of the prior years presented has been recast in accordance with Ind AS.
