**Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Statements**



### **Report on the Internal Financial Controls under Clause (i) of Sub-section 3 of Section 143 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act")**


### **Opinion**




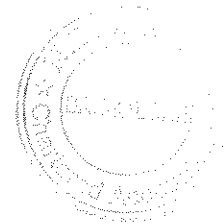
The financial statements are presented in USD which is the company's functional currency. All financial information is presented in USD unless otherwise stated.
